As many of you know, this is the clubs largest fundraiser since the Flea Market pre COVID-19. The view of your editor and secretary (and not necessarily that of the club) is that we'll need to identify other sources of funds in the coming years to support the various outreach activities of the Marketing and Membership Committees in addition to supporting our memberships various activities from the Beach Outing to the Banquet. While we have our annual events, the club also encourages ideas for the Events Committee to consider to hold throughout the year, which include dinner nights out and other social events.

Rob Foley did an excellent job interfacing with Ragnar and setting up volunteers at the various exchanges and ensuring we had the coverage required for the event to go off without a hitch. The amount of effort to herd the cats (I mean myself and the South Shore Neptunes) is significant. From phone calls, emails, text messages to ensure we had enough people to maximize the return to the club.

May 26, 2024 Club Dive

60 minutes, 15-20 ft vis, 57 °F, 40 ft max depth Story by Rob Vice

Adrienne Murphy, Chuck Zarba, Doug Eaton, Sokol Prifti, Jesse Hayes, Stephanie Beels and I showed up at the former clubhouse on the corner of Joyce Road and Quarry Street in Quincy discussing the dive options for the day. Stephanie and Jesse both only had partial kits and Adrienne was also out. Alex Wieck was onboard to dive as well and was waiting to see if he would host the club dive on his boat or meet up for a shore dive. Chuck and Doug decided to dive Pleasure bay and suggested Sokol and I head to meet up with Alex for a boat dive.

This is where our story departs, as I did not catch the full story from Doug or Chuck, but I do know they found some bottles and made it to the trench.

Sokol and I headed to the Quincy public boat launch next to Quincy Yacht Club and waited for Alex to show up. We watched some folks launching jet skis and a boat and got the call from Alex on a boat problem in the river ending in calling the boat off. Sokol and I decided to dive somewhere on the south shore, either Egypt Beach or Peggotty Beach. On the drive south, Alex was able to make his way back into the South Shore Yacht Club and we were able to carpool south making for the three of us not missing out on diving, albeit a bit late.

We wound up diving off North Scituate Beach and Bar Rock. On the way out, we saw eel grass and Alex spotted a good sized sculpin that was lazing about.
