Dive Reports

From the August general meeting:

- 1. Rob Robison has a crew of divers that dive at 5pm on Fridays.
- 2. Chuck dove with Doug today to do a job in Squantum to measure Zinc with visibility of 4 inches. Water was warm. Jay Theriault was helping by providing a camera and slate.
- 3. Rick Hovey Sunday Aug 4 and linked up with some free divers at Foley Cove and acted as a lobster spotter. Then met Ken at Lanes Cove, but didn't jump in and acted as shore support. Jessie was snorkeling too.
- Rob Robison Plymouth Beach and Alisa Daniels, Mike Whiteside. Saw interesting fish. A Grubby and anemones that haven't been around. Also dove at Pebble Beach and brought in 8 lobsters, four were between 2-4 lbs.
- 5. Bruce Lane Last Thursday and Yesterday at Satans Ledge and another spot up in Marblehead. Limited both times at 15 each and got a half bag of lobsters another time. Salem is still cold 45ft is 45 F.
- 6. Club Dive Loblolly Chuck caught 2 lobsters. Ken, Adrienne, Evan Bodell, Paul Greene.
- 7. Alex Paul Greene, Todd and Rob Vice were diving off his boat. Saw a lobster in a large cave and jammed his hand in and the lobster clamped the tip of his finger and got it at 3.91 lb.

From the September general meeting:

- 1. Will Tinney, Rachel, Paul got their 3rd dive in. 20ft for over an hour. Lots of egger lobsters. Easy dive.
- 2. Chuck Doug, Sokol and Chuck did an underwater cleanup at Pleasure Bay
- 3. Rob Robison Sunday off Plymouth Beach with 10-15 ft of viz down for an hour. Saw a flat clawed hermit crab and a pipefish. See more on his Facebook.
- Bruce Lane Dove last Tuesday and Thursday on Satans again. They went for scallops and got two gallons between three divers. Today dove Egg Rock, his brother got 8 lobsters and Bruce got 9 lobsters.
- 5. Sokol Prifti Dove last week Tuesday at 40 steps with two dives. Foggy in the morning, but the water was calm. Visibility was pretty good and others murky by white algae. 1 hour dive, saw horseshoe crabs, lobsters, starfish and a lot of fish. Huge tautog. Visibility was up to 10-15 ft. Saw a huge female lobster with rubber bands around the claws. Caught 4 lobsters, one was close to 4lb. Recorded a video and posted on YouTube
- 6. Rick Hovey dove with Calvin Stephenson and Evan Bodell at Canoe Beach, Nahant
- 7. Matt Ramos and Terry went to Las Rocas in Roatan, Honduras. Stayed at Cocoa View. Second largest reef in the world. Took a photo class with Micky and has a book which is the bible for diving there. 95% of what is in the book you will see there. Ken wants Matt to organize a trip there. Two tanks. Happy hour 3-6.
- 8. Bill Gallagher, Chuck Zarba went with Dave Robinson up to Cornel Point to see the remnants of a shipwreck. Took over 72 hours for the photogrammetry. It generated 44 million points out of 800 photos and showed part of the wreck that is there. Showed up the next day, and took additional photos and is being processed now. Met at the Essex Shipbuilding museum, which was established in the 1600s.

Sarah Goodman, MaryAnn Dakkak and Jason Tauches swam two dives, both coves, at Fort Wetherill. They started with the eastern cove where they found flounder, starfish and two lost tropicals brought by the Gulf Stream: a butterfly fish and an indigo hamlet fish



The visibility was fairly poor, just 3-6 ft, worse the deeper they got. They walked over to the western cove for their next dive and found some echinoderms (urchins) and more indigo hamlet fish. All in all a great dive day!


